Spasticity can lead to debilitating pain and its management is essential for improving the quality of life for those affected. Baclofen has been proven to be an effective treatment for improving motor function, thereby enabling individuals to achieve greater independence and engage more fully in daily activities.

The inclusion of baclofen on the Model Lists of Essential Medicines would be a significant step towards ensuring that this vital, cost effective medication is accessible for all who need it, regardless of circumstances. By recognizing baclofen as an essential medicine, the WHO would not only acknowledge its importance in the management of spasticity but also promote global equity in healthcare by supporting its widespread distribution. This action would undoubtedly lead to better health outcomes and improved quality of life for many individuals living with cerebral palsy.
