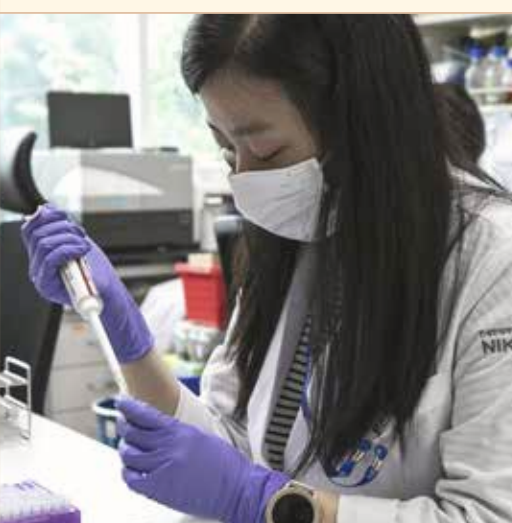


WHO Global Summit on Traditional Medicine

The World Health Organization (WHO) Global Traditional Medicine Centre will convene the second WHO Global Summit on Traditional Medicine. Building on the success of the inaugural Summit in 2023 and landmark Gujarat Declaration, the 2025 Summit will delve deeper into the science and knowledge shaping Traditional Medicine and include announcements of **new pledges, products and innovations**.

The Summit will bring together global leaders, scientists, Traditional Medicine practitioners and communities to foster partnerships, advance implementation of the new WHO Global Traditional Medicine Strategy 2025–2034 and translate the Gujarat Declaration into concrete action.

Plenary sessions – explored further through a series of 16 parallel sessions – will cover:

- **Restoring balance: The science and practice of health and well-being**
Framing pathways towards equity, justice and global health.
- **Investing in science to drive traditional medicine progress**
Innovating for sustainable development and universal health coverage.
- **Re-imagining health systems for balance, safety and resilience**
Strengthening health care through traditional medicine integration.
- **Measuring progress and charting the way forward**
Scaling up data generation, setting standards and fostering accountability.

The Summit will launch a robust **roadmap** of research priorities for all WHO regions, comprehensive **WHO Traditional Medicine Global Library** and **WHO Bulletin** Special Issue on Traditional Medicine.

In addition, the **Global Summit Exhibition** will be an immersive space for personal learning and to experience Traditional Medicine from around the world through interactive displays, talks and events.

A **high-level ministerial meeting and inaugural event** on 17 December will complement the Summit to galvanize momentum and political commitment towards the goals of the Summit and WHO Global Traditional Medicine Strategy.
