





2025 GLOBAL CONFERENCE ON HEALTH AND CLIMATE: ACTION AND EQUITY

The 2025 Global Conference on Climate and Health will take place in Brasília, Brazil, from 29 to 31 July 2025. The event aims at consolidating and sharing the existing evidence on the implementation of health adaptation policies to climate change and address health co-benefits from ambitious and just climate actions at the international, national, and subnational levels. In this context, placing health equity and social participation is essential to the action agenda for the health sector and to the success of COP30.

This Global Conference is co-organized by the Government of Brazil, the World Health Organization (WHO), the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), and the Alliance for Transformative Action on Climate and Health (ATACH). The 2025 convening will mark the V Global Conference on Climate and Health and will serve as the annual, in-person meeting of ATACH members.

The program will showcase innovation and impact from a range of stakeholders in implementing climate-health strategies to improve health through plenary sessions, panel discussions, workshops, open discussions, and dynamic Idea Labs sessions. The topic areas will be structured around the three lines of action of the Belém Health Action Plan:

- Health Surveillance and Monitoring;
- Evidence-based Policy Strategy and Capacity Building;
- Innovation and Production.

Main Outcomes:

- Concrete inputs to the <u>Belém Health Action Plan's draft</u>;
- Articulation of countries' responsibilities and commitments under ATACH to support the Belém Health Action Plan;
- Defined pathways to promote health as a core pillar of climate action in the lead-up to COP30;
- Scientific deliverables to support the implementation of the Belém Health Action Plan.
