## Interim guidance on social and behavioural research for mpox

**Rationale:** data and evidence on the lives and realities of people impacted by mpox outbreaks is needed for public health response.

**Aim**: to clarify standards for **high quality, ethica**l, social and behavioural research for mpox community protection

**Guidance developed:** over 4 months with 170+ people involved – Ministries of health, operational partners, ethics experts, academics, civil society – based on rapid review of international ethics guidance and frameworks for research in emergencies and multiple rounds of consultation.

**Content**: (1) Design and delivery, (2) Stakeholder engagement, (3) Ethical conduct and oversight, (4) Data protection and sharing, (5) Environment for social and behavioural research

**Using the guidance**: operational support tools and HIVE community of practice
