



12800 New HSDUs added

Over the course of 2022, six new projects have been implemented in Bangladesh (Cox's Bazar), DRC (Ituri), Ethiopia (Afar and Amhara), Iraq, Mozambique (Cabo Delgado and Nampula) and Ukraine. Across all active projects, close to 13 000 new HSDUs were added and over 56 000 HSDU updates were submitted.

In 2022, over 3000 new users signed up for the HeRAMS platform, an increase of 37%, bringing the cumulative number of registered users to over 8000.

Throughout 2022, 47 training workshops were conducted across 12 countries reaching over 1700 participants. Using a combination of on-site, online and hybrid training modalities, participants were trained in the HeRAMS methodology and how to use and contribute data.
