Sessions

Welcome and meeting objectives

- Opening remarks will be made by the Director-General.
- The Executive Board, at its 133rd session, under agenda item 5 on WHO reform (see document EB133/16) requested the Director-General to organize an informal consultation with Member States and non-State actors.
- The consultations are not expected to lead to a consensus at this stage. The debate is expected to inform the Secretariat in its drafting of a proposal to be submitted to the Executive Board at its 134th session in January 2014.

Introduction

- The Secretariat has described the key issues related to engagement with non-State actors and made proposals on possible reform in a background paper. It will provide an overview of current engagement with non-State actors and these proposals for reform.
- The Director-General has appointed a Special Envoy on WHO's engagement with non-State actors in order to consult informally with Member States and non-State actors. The Special Envoy will be invited to provide feedback on the main issues raised in these consultations.
- Participants will be invited to provide general comments.

Proposed changes in due diligence, management of risks of engagement and transparency

- The Secretariat will present the proposals for improved due diligence, management of risks of engagement including conflicts of interest and transparency.
- Participants will be invited to comment on the proposals.

Enhancing engagement with non-State actors

- The Secretariat will present the current modes of engagement and how they could be improved.
- Participants will be invited to comment on the proposed reforms to enhance engagement.

Conclusion and the way forward

• The Secretariat will propose a summary of the discussion and outline the next steps and the process to move ahead.
