






WHO Initiative to Measure the Effectiveness and Impact of Public Health Social Measures (PHSM) during Health Emergencies

 Multiyear initiative launched in June 2021 to accelerate PHSM research and strengthen precision in PHSM policies and implementation





Strengthening the global evidence base on PHSM & making it accessible

Global PHSM Research Agenda 2021-2030:

- 6 research themes
- Based on one expert consultation and two public surveys
- Urgent research priorities for COVID-19 and medium-term priorities for infectious diseases
- Second survey available in English, French and Spanish:









Strengthening the global evidence base on PHSM & making it accessible

PHSM Protocol Templates:

- Timely, comparable, high-quality data on intervention effectiveness for decision-making
- Accelerated ethical approval process during emergencies
- Use non-emergency phase for research and capacity building
- 8 draft protocols being developed through extensive expert input and iterative review process





Strengthening the global evidence base on PHSM & making it accessible

Evidence reviews:

- Systematic review of systematic reviews of the effectiveness and health and socioeconomic consequences of PHSM during COVID-19 (n=107 reviews)
- Scoping review on social protection policies implemented during COVID-19 to mitigate negative consequences of PHSM (n=322 studies)
- Mapping of existing WHO guideline recommendations with relevance to PHSM

Digital Solution for PHSM Research:

- Will be a publicly accessible one-stop shop for PHSM research
- Database of primary studies and living systematic reviews
- Mapping of research against global PHSM research agenda
- Multi-lingual
