









Extreme poverty* is overwhelmingly rural, with 4 out of five people experiencing extreme poverty living in rural areas...





Rural poverty and being employed in agriculture

- Rural poverty is strongly associated with employment in agriculture.
- Nearly two-thirds of extremely poor workers reported that their primary job is in the agricultural sector.
- Extreme poverty rates among agricultural workers is more than four times higher than among non-agricultural workers.
- Just more than half of the moderate poor (defined as persons living on between \$1.90 and \$3.10 per day in 2013) work in the agriculture sector.
