Health Equity in All Policies Approach










Regional cross-sectoral coordination mechanism






PHC strengthening prevention, health promotion and GER

Key learnings



- Shared understanding of challenges and goals are key for collaboration across sectors
- Transparent accountability, roles and funding for achieving joint targets
- Policy entrepreneurs, champions and role-models are fundamental in agenda setting as in implementation and innovative solutions
- Good practices in small scale not enough for system change, sustainability
- System solutions such as coordination mechanisms, financial incentives and joint monitoring frameworks are essential
- The health system with PH institutes and PHC centers has played a leading role in reducing health inequalities, particularly for NCDs, in Slovenia.
- An integrated multidisciplinary approach requires transforming service delivery, so governance, funding and competencies are aligned.
- Health system at the same time is local employer and procurer that can set standards
