

Getting "PRET" for the next pandemic: Where are we now?





Overview

- PRET (Preparedness and Resilience for **Emerging Threats**) is an approach to pandemic preparedness and response planning launched by WHO in 2023.
- PRET applies a "mode of transmission lens" to preparedness for future pandemics.
- PRET is being rolled out globally through regional and national workshops and simulation exercises.
- The design and implementation of PRET draws on lessons from recent epidemics and pandemics.







First PRET Module: Respiratory Pathogens


- New organizing framework with operational stages, triggers and assumptions to help structure plans
- Provides key actions, organized in five subsystems
 ('5Cs'), to strengthen respiratory pandemic preparedness
- Three tiers for preparedness strengthening: cross-cutting, pathogen group, and pathogen specific
- Outlines ways to take a whole-of-society approach
- Tools and resources to support planning and preparedness
- Living document

Future modules will focus on other modes of transmission.

54 countries from 5 regions


started updating their pandemic plans




By end of 2023:
