








# PRET Module 1: Respiratory pathogens

### First PRET Module: Respiratory Pathogens

- New organizing framework with operational stages, triggers and assumptions to help structure plans
- Provides key actions, organized in five subsystems ('5Cs'), to strengthen respiratory pandemic preparedness
- Three tiers for preparedness strengthening: cross-cutting, pathogen group, and pathogen specific
- Outlines ways to take a whole-of-society approach
- Tools and resources to support planning and preparedness
- Living document

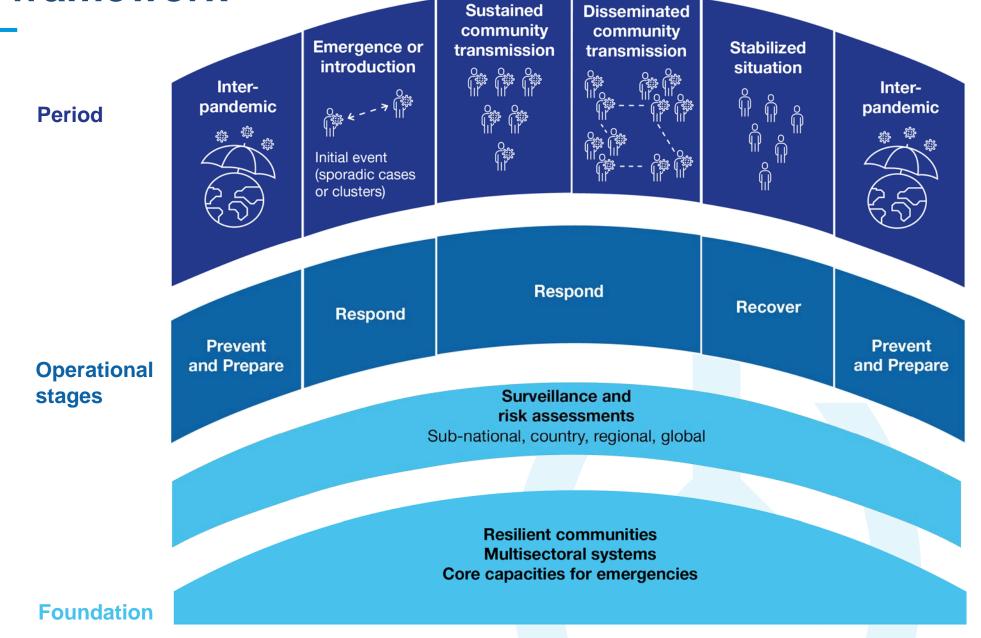
Accompanied by **collaborative platforms** to support countries & partners to develop, test and update plans, and monitor preparedness

## Step for respiratory pathogen pandemic planning

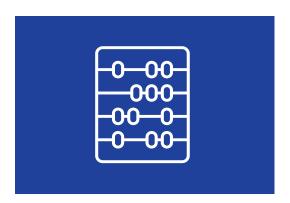

started updating their pandemic plans




By end of 2023:
