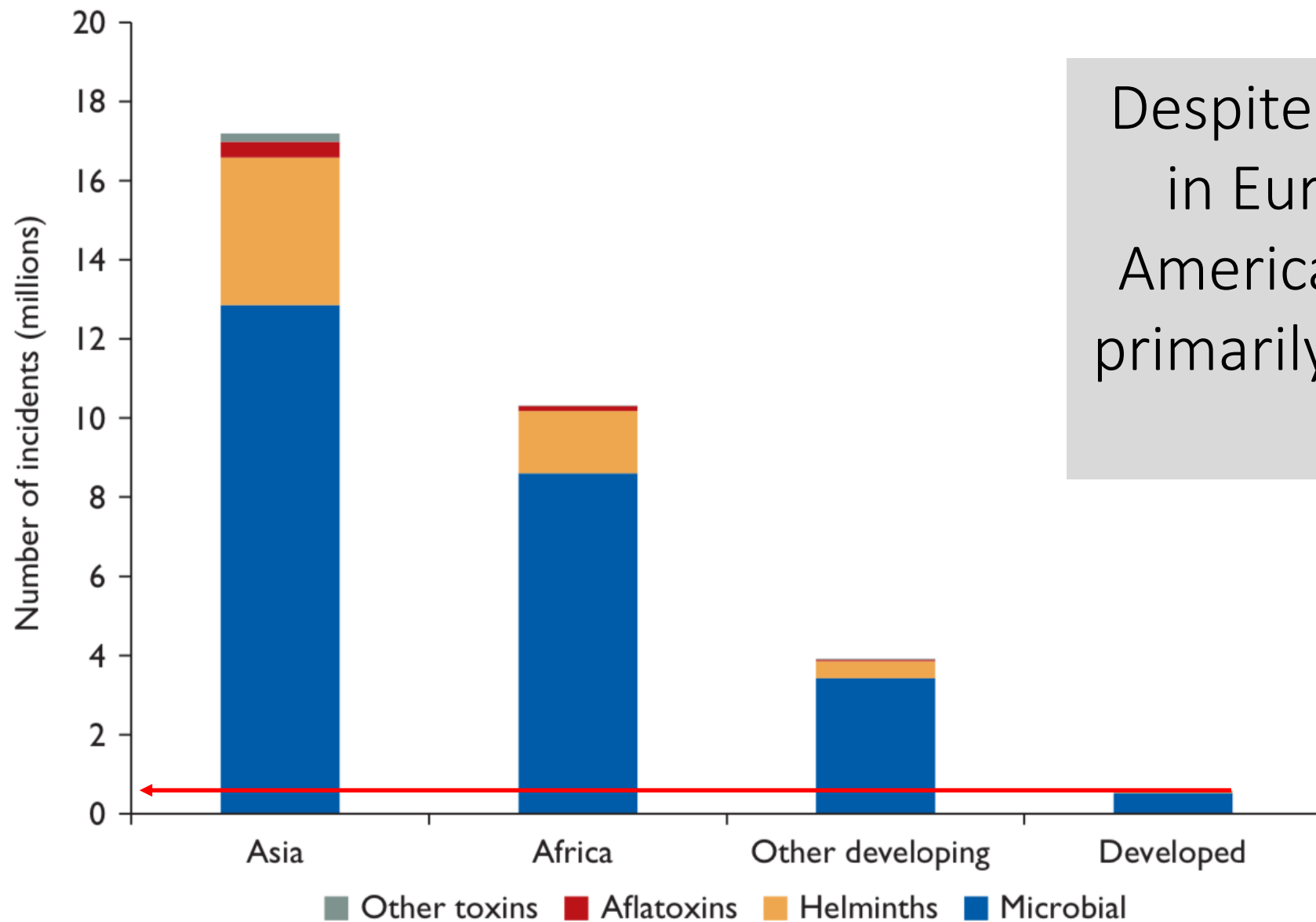

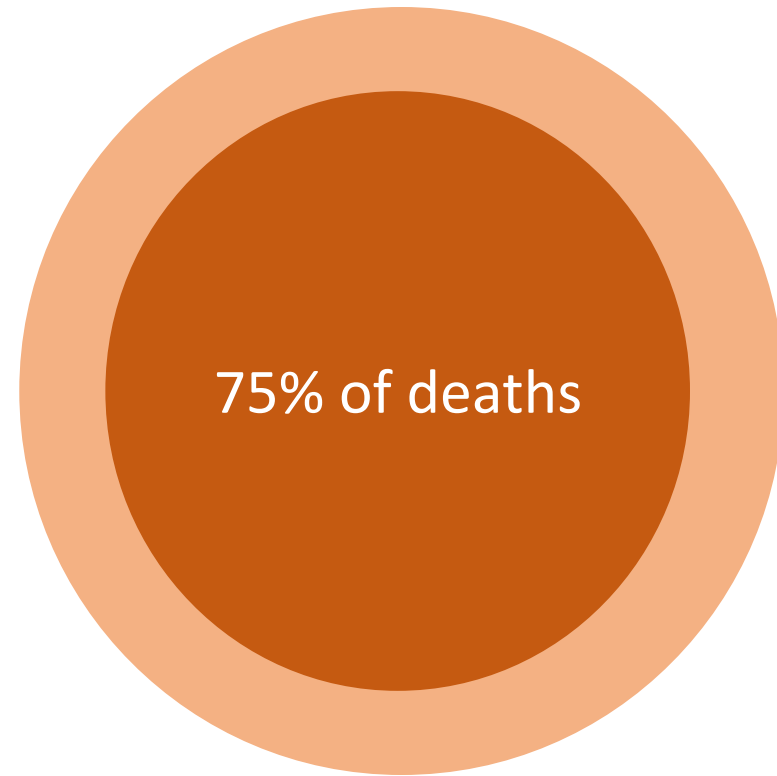
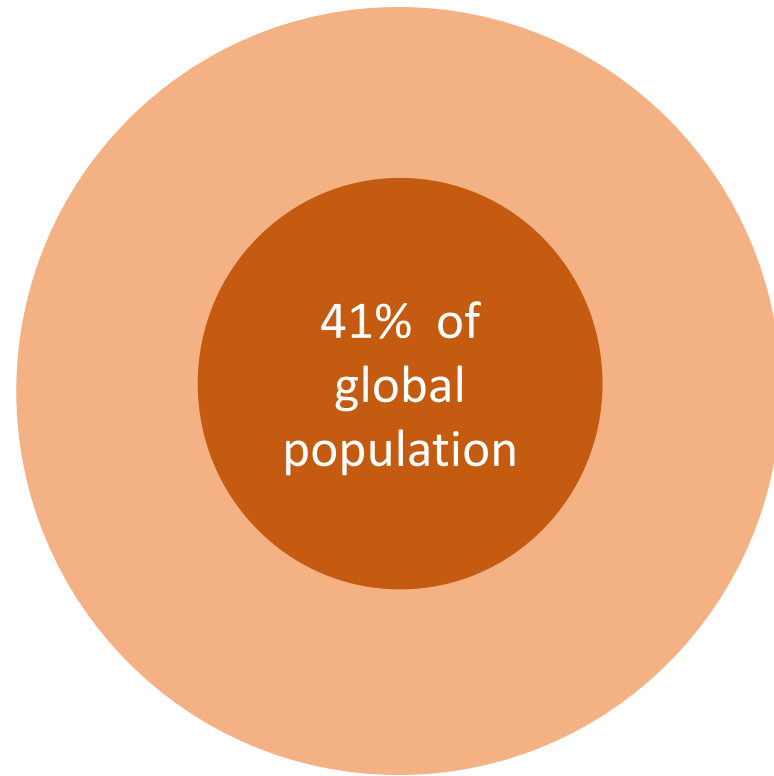


Despite all the headlines in Europe and North America, the problem is primarily outside of those regions

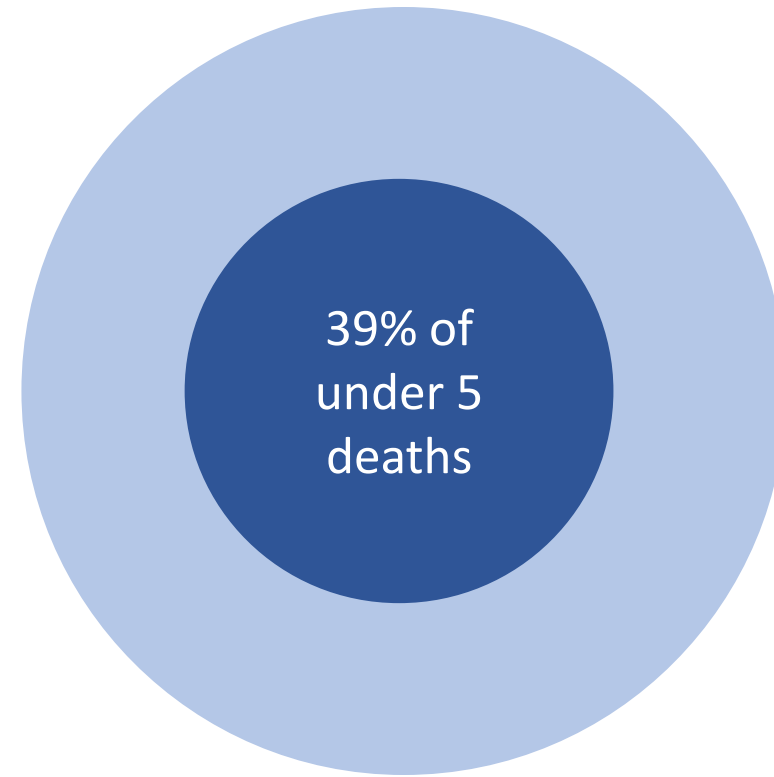
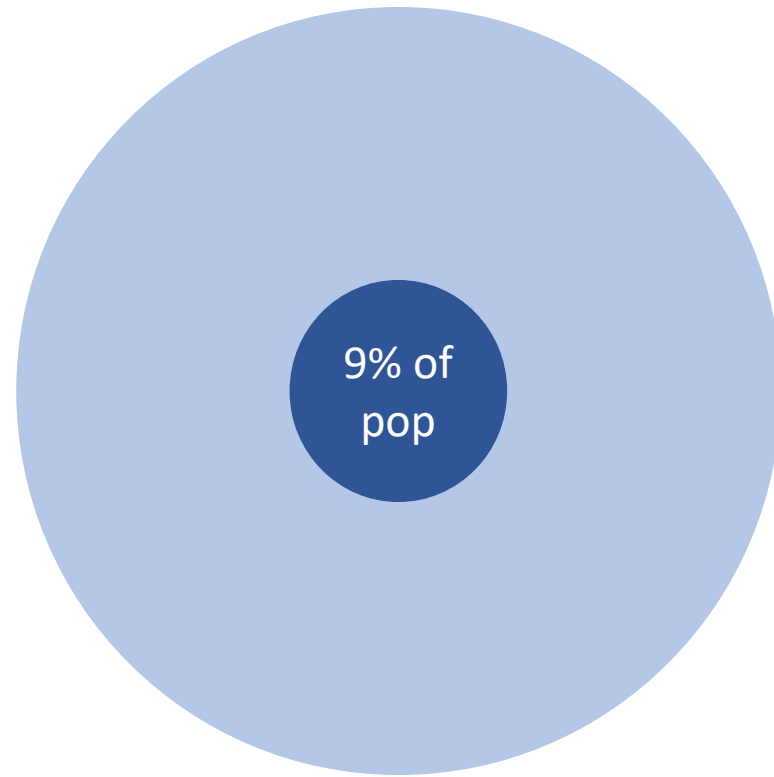

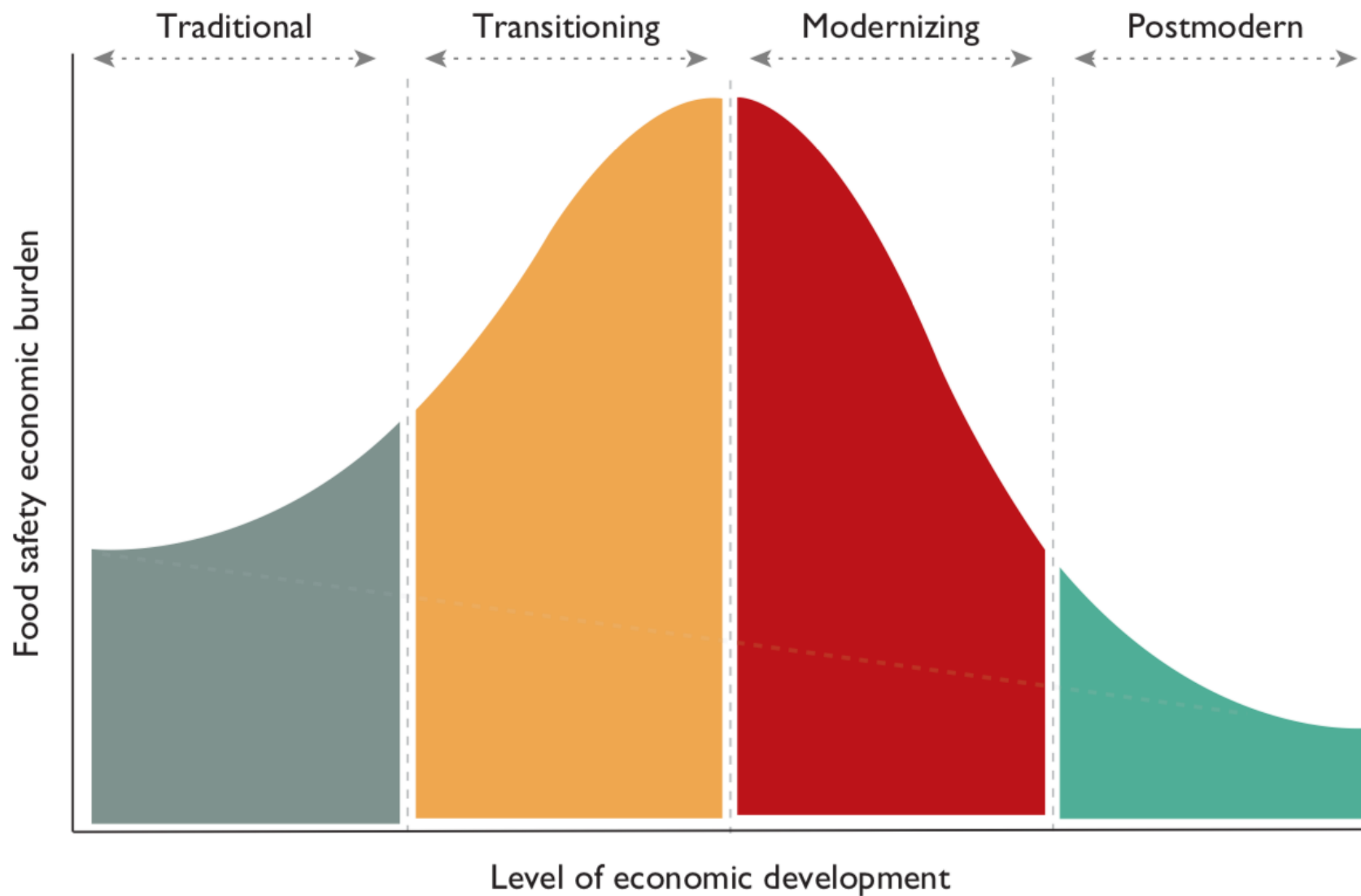

Children under 5 bear a heavy burden of food borne diseases



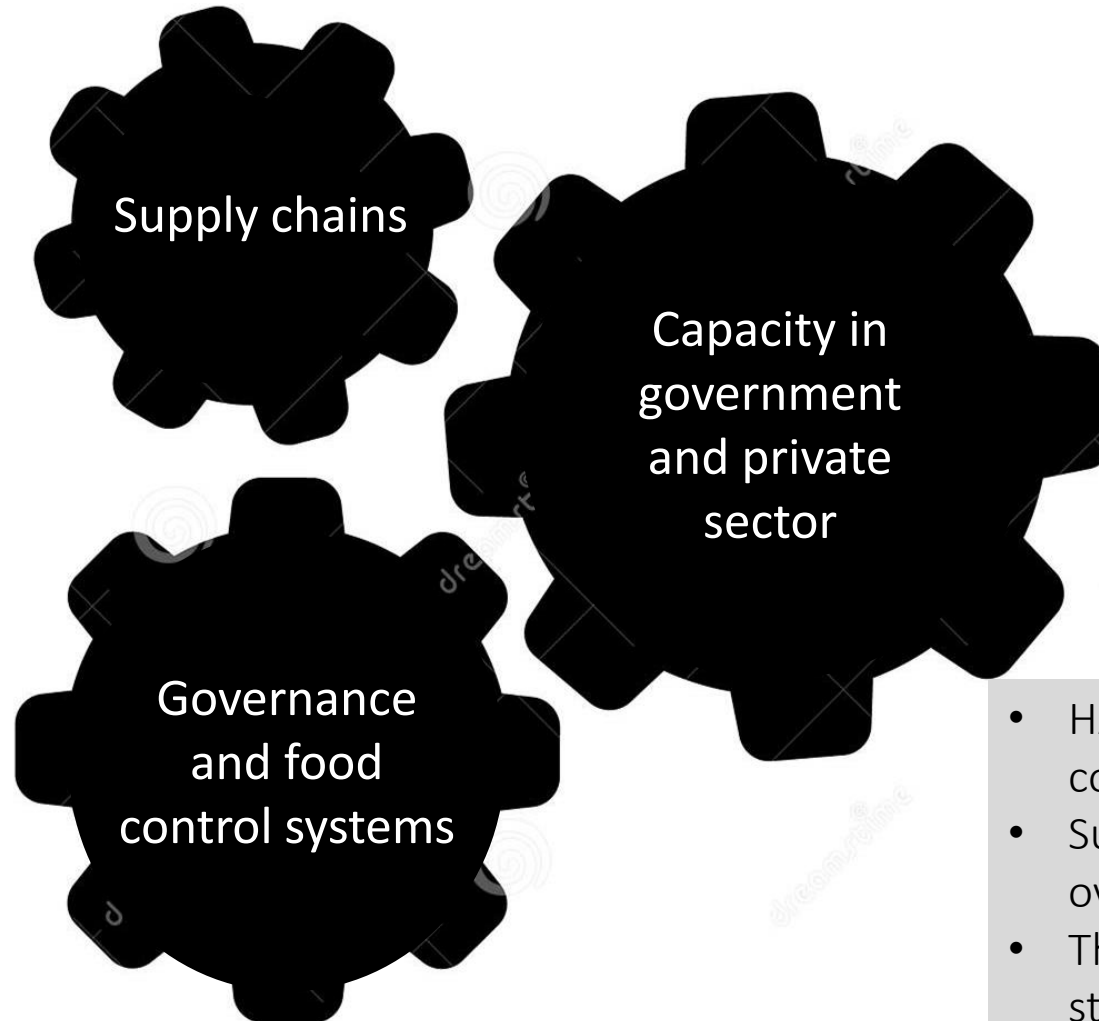


Food Safety measures are playing **catch up** as food systems transition

- Laboratories

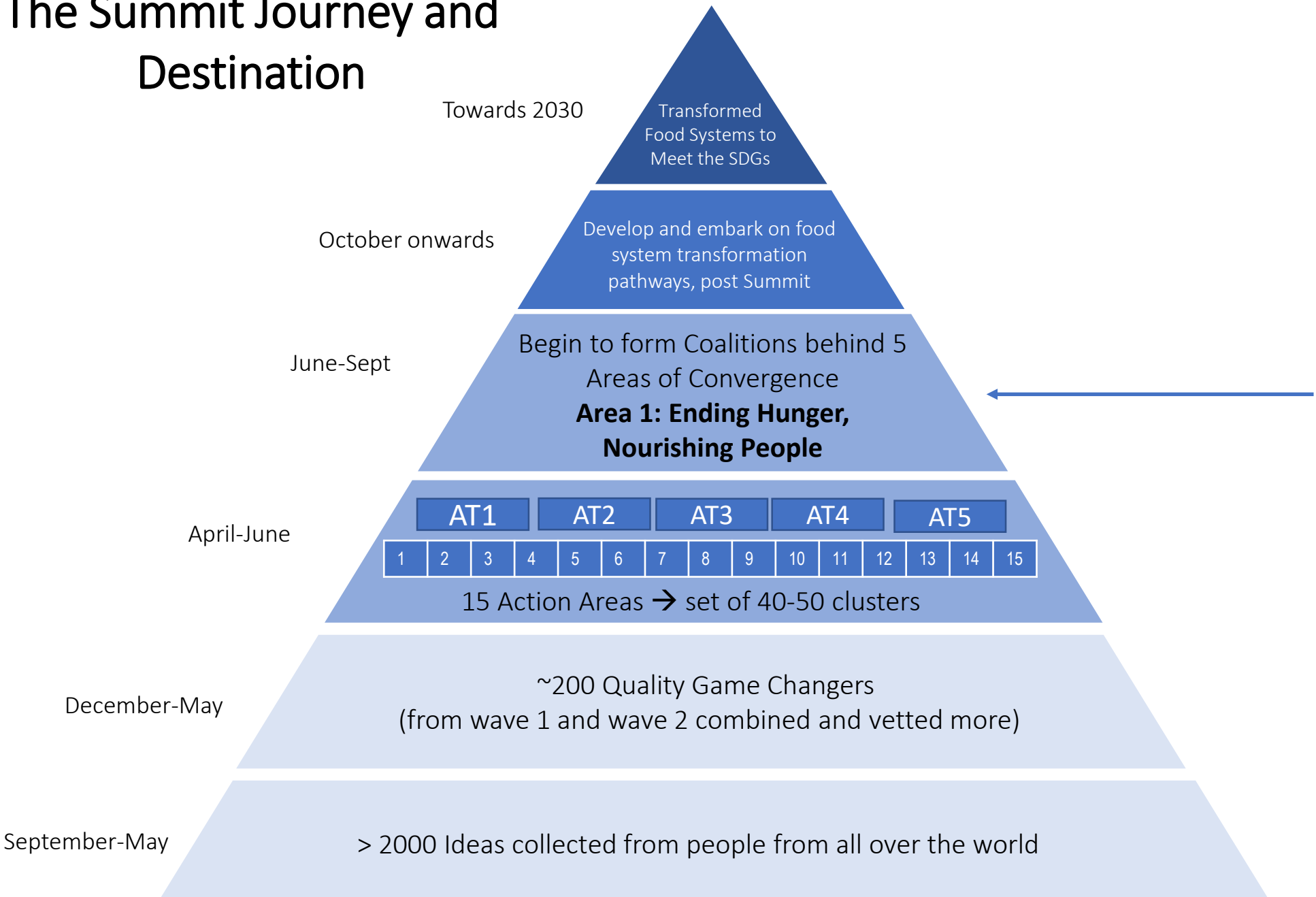

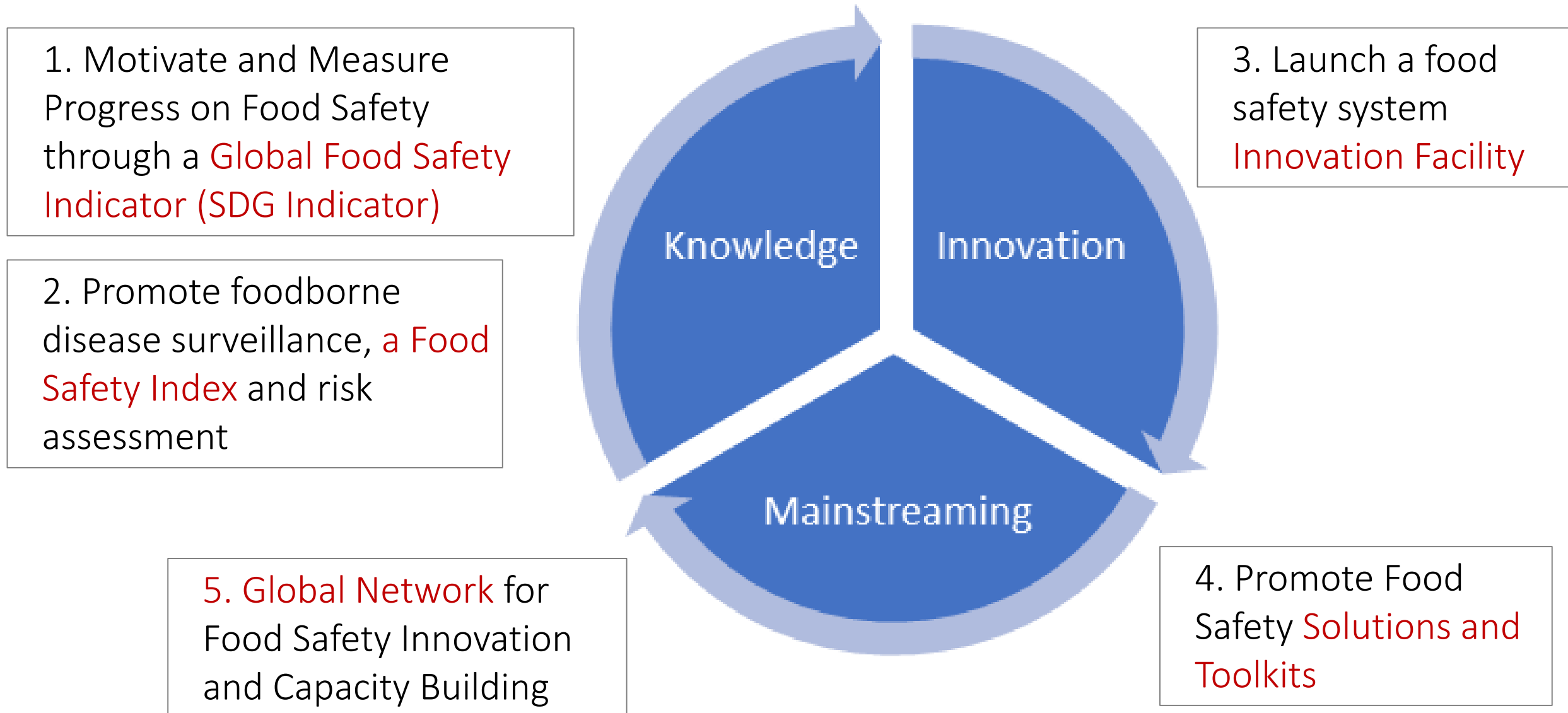
