

WHO survey on gonorrhoea treatment

The World Health Organization (WHO) is conducting short anonymous online surveys on gonorrhoea treatment.

Adults aged 18 years or older may be eligible to take part, either as community respondents or as health care providers, programme managers, or other professionals working in relevant roles.

The surveys explore views on gonorrhoea treatment, including preferences, acceptability, access, feasibility and related considerations from both community and provider perspectives. Participation is voluntary and anonymous. The findings will help inform future WHO guidance on gonorrhoea treatment. No personal identifying information will be collected. Each survey takes approximately 5–10 minutes.
