

WHO Task Force on TB Impact Measurement Meeting of the sub-group on TB disease prevalence survey 28–30 January 2009, Geneva

Draft Agenda

Objectives

- 1. To discuss key methodological issues concerning TB disease prevalence surveys, with particular attention to issues that were not fully covered in the book *Assessing TB* prevalence through population-based surveys or in subsequent meetings of the WHO Task Force on TB Impact Measurement. Four issues that need further discussion and guidance have been identified. These are: (i) X-ray quality assurance and standardized readings, (ii) data management, (iii) statistical analysis and (iv) bacteriological examination.
- 2. To review draft protocols for disease prevalence surveys that have been developed by several of the 21 countries where the Task Force has recommended that surveys should be implemented, and to provide feedback to these countries.
- 3. To define the lead international agencies that will coordinate the provision of technical and financial support to each of the 21 global focus countries where the Task Force has recommended that surveys should be implemented, as well as the international agencies and/or independent consultants that will provide specialized technical support for specific components of surveys where this is needed.
- 4. To discuss how to address the current bottlenecks to the implementation of the TB disease prevalence surveys

Expected Outcomes

- 1. The Sub-group of the Task Force has obtained consensus on how some key methodological issues common to all disease prevalence surveys should be handled in the protocols and during the implementation phase
- 2. The Sub-group of the Task Force has reviewed all the protocols of the TB disease prevalence surveys available at WHO-HQ by mid-January 2009, and produced a list of suggested points to be revised
- 3. The lead agencies that will provide the overall technical support to each of the countries and the agencies or independent consultants that will provide technical support in specific areas of expertise to all of the countries that will implement TB disease prevalence surveys in the next 3 years have been identified
- 4. Clear plan on how to address the current bottlenecks to the implementation of the TB disease prevalence surveys
