FIRST WHO GLOBAL MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE ENDING TB IN THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT ERA: A MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE

16-17 NOVEMBER 2017, MOSCOW, RUSSIAN FEDERATION



TB IS THE **LEADING INFECTIOUS KILLER**IN THE WORLD & ONE OF THE **TOP 10 CAUSES OF DEATH WORLDWIDE**

BACKGROUND

Tuberculosis (TB) is the **leading infectious killer worldwide** and one of the top ten causes of deaths. Every day, nearly 5000 people die from TB and more than 30 000 people fall ill with this disease. This preventable and curable disease is deeply rooted in communities "left behind" -- where poverty is pervasive and human rights and dignity are limited. The devastating social and economic impact on people affected and their families is profound. Drug-resistant TB is the most common and lethal airborne antimicrobial resistant disease in the world today and a global health security threat, responsible for 240 000 deaths each year.

Although **53 million lives have been saved** since 2000, the pace of progress is slow and **actions and investments fall far short of those needed** to end the TB epidemic.


To ramp up the TB response and accelerate efforts to reach the end TB targets set as part of the UN Sustainable Development Agenda and the WHO End TB Strategy, Ministers of Health and other sectors will come together at the **First WHO Global Ministerial Conference on Ending TB in the Sustainable Development Era.** The conference will be held in Moscow, Russian Federation, on 16-17 November 2017.

VISION

✓ To accelerate efforts of all WHO Member States in ending the global TB epidemic in line with the targets set by the WHO End TB Strategy and the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

MINISTERIAL DECLARATION

- ✓ Ministers will sign a high-level Declaration containing bold commitments by countries to accelerate action to end TB.
- ✓ This will inform the first UN General Assembly High Level Meeting on TB in 2018.

COMMUNICATIONS OBJECTIVES

- ✓ Raise awareness and engage public discussion on the importance of ending TB in the lead up to the Conference;
- ✓ Create a conversation on ending TB that will extend far beyond the Conference itself;
- ✓ Build an understanding of the importance of multisectoral engagement and action as imperative to defeating TB;
- ✓ Promote examples of good multisectoral engagement leading to improvements in conditions for ending TB;
- ✓ Build platforms and momentum to lead from Ministerial Declaration in 2017 to UNGA high level meeting in 2018.

OVERARCHING MESSAGES

- ✓ TB is the leading infectious disease killer worldwide today, and among the top ten causes of death. It carries profound economic and social consequences;
- ✓ Current actions and investments by countries fall short of what is needed to end TB;
- ✓ Ending the TB epidemic by 2030 is a key health target of the UN Sustainable Development Goals and the WHO End TB Strategy;
- Ending TB requires concerted action by all sectors to provide the right services, support and enabling safe environment in the right place, at the right time. Everyone has a role to play in ending TB individuals, communities, businesses, governments, societies;
- ✓ Progress on TB is a contributor to, and an indicator of, sustainable development (SDG tracer);
- Everyone with TB should have access to rapid diagnosis, treatment and care. This is a matter of social justice, fundamental to WHO's goal of universal health coverage;
- Ending TB is a moral imperative and makes economic sense; for every US\$1 invested to end TB, US\$ 43 is returned as the benefits of a healthy functioning society.
