

MOV pre-assessment checklist

The following are a list of requirements that are essential for an MOV assessment to run successfully.

At least 3-6 months before field work:		
Do you have a functional multi-partner MOV Strategy Team (MST) of 3-5 persons at the national level?	Yes □	No
Has each member of the MST read and understood the MOV Planning Guide (available at http://www.who.int/immunization/programmes_systems/policies_strategies/MOV/en/)		
Have you obtained high-level support from the Ministry of Health (MOH) for the MOV assessment and ensured their availability for debriefing?		
Have you engaged in-country partners in the MOV assessment and ensured they are available for brainstorming debriefing?		
Do you have a commitment from in-country partners to participate in the MOV assessment?		
Have you extensively reviewed the budget for this activity?		
Have you ensured that a country (MOH) focal point will be available to fully commit their time before, during and post the MOV assessment?		
Do you require a loan of WHO-owned tablets for the assessment?		
Have you provided us with a clear overview of routine immunization practices e.g. on immunization days, do clinics offer other services?		



At least 2 months before field work:

Have you provided us with a chronogram of the proposed activities?	Yes □	No
Have you identified field teams to collect data?		
Have you secured a location for training?		
Have you made arrangements for reliable WiFi for training and brainstorming sessions?		
Does the training location have good audio facilities e.g. microphone/speakers?		
If applicable, have you arranged for simultaneous translation during training?		
Have you updated the MOV questionnaires to reflect your country context and routine immunization schedule?		
If applicable, have you translated the questionnaires and other field tools to the local language?		
At least 2-4 weeks before field work:	.,	
Have you provided us with a list of health facilities with information about health facility type, setting (urban/rural), if they are public/private, who runs them (NGO, MOH, etc.)? (Aim for a mix, including 30% private health facilities in the sample)	Yes □	No
Have you provided us with the schedule of the routine immunization sessions in the facilities where the assessments will be carried out? (They need to be vaccinated on a vaccination day, if they do not have daily sessions)		
Have you reviewed the training agenda and field deployment plan?		
Have you arranged the logistics for transport of the field teams?
