### **1. Purpose of the Consultancy or AWP** (whichever is applicable)

The purpose of this contract is to conduct baseline assessment on injection safety using WHO Tool C Revised after necessary modifications and pilot testing. The assessment will be a survey which has to be implemented according to the required methodology and in line with international standards in order to produce injection safety baseline data.

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### 3. Background

For more than 15 years, WHO and its partners have developed and implemented strategies for reducing unnecessary injections worldwide and for making them safer including the launch and maintenance of a very active Safe Injection Global Network (SIGN). Major progress has been achieved especially in the field of immunization but there still remains significant work to be accomplished considering that, about 95% of injections is performed for therapeutic purposes. To strengthen and focus efforts on IS, in 2015 WHO has launched a new global policy which recommends the use of pre-qualified (by WHO or other recognized bodies) safety engineered injection devices in therapeutic services, highlights the importance of strengthening and sustaining past efforts in immunization services, and encourages reducing unnecessary injections for therapeutic use, when there is a suitable alternative formulation available. Based on the new policy as a cornerstone, WHO launched a global injection safety campaign in order to promote adoption and implementation of the policy at country level, and a related country implementation strategy to be pilot-tested in three countries. India, Uganda and Egypt are the three pilot countries.
