Bio: Professor Rogerson is a clinician-scientist trained in infectious diseases. He has over 25 years' experience working on malaria, predominantly on pathogenesis, immunity and prevention of malaria in pregnant women and young children. This includes several years in Malawi (supported by the Wellcome Trust) and involvement in two large malaria prevention studies in Papua New Guinea, including leading a large trial evaluating intermittent preventive treatment in pregnancy. This trial was undertaken under the auspices of the Malaria in Pregnancy Consortium, of which Prof Rogerson was a member from 2008-2017. He led two of the Consortium's Major Activities and was on the Consortium executive for two years. He has participated in several WHO Expert Review Groups on malaria in pregnancy and Technical Advisory groups over recent years.

Prof Rogerson leads a research group at the Doherty Institute at the University of Melbourne where his current work, in collaboration with clinicians and scientists in Papua New Guinea, Malawi and Benin, has a major emphasis on identifying targets and features of protective antibody responses in pregnant women and young children. He leads the Australian Centre for Research Excellence in Malaria Elimination, supported by the NHMRC, and he is also working on iron and biomarkers as predictors of adverse pregnancy outcomes and collaborates on studies of prevention of prematurity (in progress) and IPTp (planned) in PNG.
