

2019 Novel Coronavirus (2019-nCoV) Emergency Readiness/ Response

Country: MALDIVES

Date: 16 / 04 / 2020

Cases reporting

- 23 confirmed cases of COVID-19 have been reported in the Maldives.
- 16 of the cases have recovered. NO DEATH of COVID-19 have been reported.
- 3 new cases have been reported in the last 24 hours. The new cases live in the same house in Male' city indicating first cases of local transmission in the city.
- 965 people are currently under quarantine and 10 in isolation facilities in the country.
- 3,365 samples have been tested, and results for 275 samples are pending as of 15 April 2020.

Developments/ activities carried out by Member State

- COVID-19 outbreak response plan for Male has been rolled out following confirmation of the case.
 Alert for Male City has been raised to Level 4 (Red color level). Movement to, from and amongst apartments of the house have been immediately restricted. Greater Male' Region is now under lockdown for 48 hours.
- 2 close contacts of the new cases in Male have also tested positive. The confirmed cases have been shifted to isolation facility and 54 additional contacts are being investigated. Kaashidhoo Island is under monitoring, as one of the contacts had travelled there.
- On 14 April 2020, 159 Maldivian nationals were repatriated from Bangalore and Cochin.
- As of 13 April 2020, a total of 9660 individuals have been released from quarantine facilities.
- On 12 April 2020, 200 migrant workers were moved to places with better living conditions to reduce risk of COVID-19 infection, and similar arrangements have been made for additional 4800.
- The Elections Commission announced that the 2020 Local Council Elections will be postponed.
- The Government has decided to issue monetary incentives to fishermen during this time.

WCO activities

- WHO continues to closely work and technically support the MOH and NEOC.
- WHO is working closely with the UNCT Maldives to advocate for and assure right of migrants in Maldives to seek care and all supportive services during the current Pandemic.
- WHO supported to update and print "Home Quarantine" guideline developed by the MOH.
- Timely sharing of updated WHO guidelines and recommendations on a regular basis.

WHO support provided to Member State

- WHO supported the Critical Care Training for doctors from hospitals at greater Male' region.
- Facilitated establishment of Go.Data tool in Maldives along with the necessary training.
- Facilitation of several training through webinars and Webex on clinical management, IPC etc.

Support requested from SEARO

- Facilitate procurement of 4 GeneXperts, 25000 COVID-19 cartridges and 10 Biosafety Cabinets.
- 50 kits of 50 E gene and 10 kits of RdRp assay and additional 750 sets of PPEs.

Support / Coordination from SEARO and other agencies

• Needs assessment to upgrade IGMH Lab to BSL 3 level.
