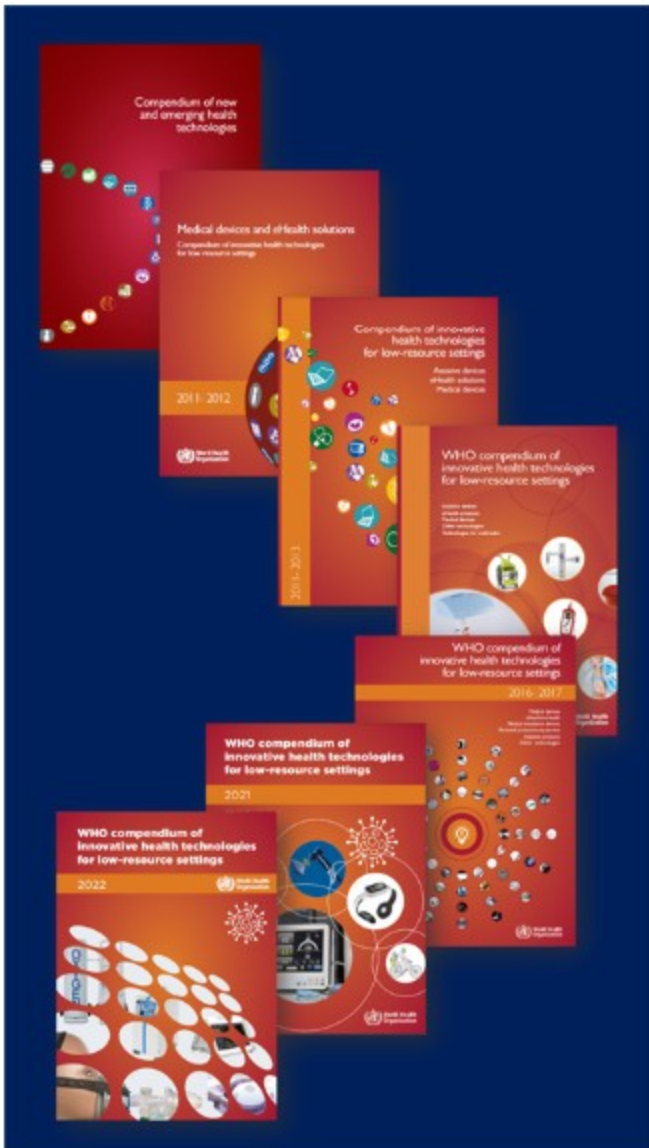

WHO Campaign on Medical Devices



The "2023 Call for Innovative Health Technologies for Low-Resource Settings" is open now and it focuses on NCDs.

Each year, 17 million people die from noncommunicable diseases (NCDs) before age 70; 86% of these premature deaths occur in low- and middle-income countries.

Low-resource settings often struggle to identify health technologies tailored to their needs. However, [innovative technologies](#) could offer a solution to their unmet needs.

WHO is pleased to announce the opening of the *2023 Call for innovative health technologies for low-resource settings*. If you or your team have developed an innovative health technology submit it today! The call is open for **prototypes**, **commercially available** technologies, and **updates** from the previous versions of the WHO Compendium.

Despite the focus on NCDs, this call also considers submissions of technologies related to other diseases and health conditions.
