PACEMAKERS - WARNING CONCERNING DANGEROUS WIRING DEFECT

The Japanese Ministry of Health and Welfare has issued a warning concerning a pacemaker in which the wire of the lead was found to penetrate the outer insulation, leading to cardiac tamponade in implanted patients, some of which were fatal.

The pacemaker is imported into Japan by Century Medical Inc., who first alerted the Ministry to the problem. It is manufactured in the United States of America by Telectronics Pacing Systems Inc.

The Ministry contacted Telectronics and was informed that approximately 42,000 pacemakers have been distributed worldwide since 1987 and 4 cases of cardiac tamponade have been reported, 2 of which were fatal. The manufacturer is investigating the cause of the defective wiring.

In Japan, in 4 pacemakers were found with lead wires which penetrated the outer insulation, and one of them caused cardiac tamponade and shock in the implanted patient.
