Background

Chronology of Telecommunication Sector's Development

1921	The Department of Post and Telegraph (DPT) was set up. It provided telegraph and post services to the recently established Trans-Jordan

	Assisted the DPT in developing telecom services and international links.

	meaning for Jordan.
1971	The Telecommunications Corporation (TCC) was established as a
	government controlled entity responsible for various telecom services,
	including telephone, telegraph and telex.
1973-1985	Jordan's telecom network expanded significantly; with the boom in oil
1773 1703	prices and the expatriates' remittances, the economy thrived and so did
	public spending by the government on networks.

1993	The Telecommunications Regulatory Commission (TRC) was established
	as independent body.
1995	The Telecommunications Law No. 13 of 1995 was passed, providing the
	legal basis for reform. As a result, the TRC was created.

<u>Telecommunication Regulatory Commission (TRC)</u> Major Duties and Responsibilities

- To regulate telecommunications and information technology services in the Kingdom in accordance with the established general policy
- To establish the basis for regulation of the telecommunications in accordance with rules and instructions issued by the Board for this purpose
- To protect the interests of users to ensure that the conditions of Licenses are observed

- To prepare and adopt the terms and conditions and criteria for the granting of Licenses for networks and telecommunications services, and for the use of the radio frequency spectrum

New Policies and Legislations regarding the Exposure to EMF

The Telecommunications Law No. 13 of 1995 amended by Law No. (8) for

the year 2002 Guidelines for limiting Exposure to EMF were set up.

Areas of Public concern and National responses

Governmental Intersectorial Committee was formed in order to answer public inquiries, questions and claims related to Health exposure and environmental impact

General Research Activities related to EMF

As there are no research activities related to EMF Health conducted in Jordan Yet, Jordan uses the scientific researches and studies provided by WHO and other international agencies. Ministry of Health in cooperation with academic and scientific institutions will conduct some research and studies specific to Jordan regarding Health and Environmental Impact.
