Report on EMF Activities 19th International Advisory Committee on EMF June 2014

The Independent Expert Group on Electromagnetic Fields of the Swedish Radiation Safety Authority (SSM) has published a new report on EMF and health. The report is in English and is available at

The Swedish Radiation Safety Authority has developed a mobile monitoring system for RF. 123'456 spectral measurements have been performed during the last two years. The measuring system and the results are presented in Bioelectromagnetics 35:227-230 (2014).

The Swedish Work Environment Authority has begun its implementation of the directive 2013/35/EU. During 2014 the authority will finalize a survey, in Sweden, regarding the presence and use of equipment which will most likely exceed the action values in the directive and where the employer must do a more careful risk assessment regarding exposure. A general problem is the lack of qualified personnel who can assess and measure EMF in the industry.

WLAN in schools is the main EMF-topic of concern among the general public. The use of TETRA has been a concern to users, especially to users within the Police force. The concern of exposure from Tetra-terminals etc. has been addressed by information, FAQs and seminars.
