1. General Research Activities

National EMF research program (NRP57)

In 2007 the Swiss Federal Council launched a national research program NRP57 "Non-ionising radiation; Environment and Health". The program covers ELF and RF, is fully sponsored by the government and runs for approximately 4 years (until 2011) with a funding of 5 Mio. CHF. The main topics of research are: dosimetry and exposure assessment, laboratory studies, epidemiologic studies, cell biological studies, risk perception. The second workshop in the frame of NRP was held on 5 and 6 May 2008 in Zurich. Its title was: "Towards a mechanism-based framework in EMF research". Information is available at: http://www.nfp57.ch

The Swiss Research Foundation on Mobile Communication (FSM)

FSM is a non-profit foundation, founded in 2002, sponsored mainly by industry, but supported by government, NGO's and research organisations. The aim of the FSM is to promote innovative research projects in the mobile phone sector and distribute the resulting research findings to scientists and the public. Following research areas are covered: basic research, risk perception &communication and technology & applied research. The annual research budget amounts to 550'000 basically. • CEFALO: An international case-control study on brain tumours in children and adolescents

The main goal of the study is to investigate whether use of mobile telephones increases the risk of

developing brain tumours for children or adolescents. In addition, the study will provide a comprehensive dataset to investigate other potential risk factors for childhood brain tumor.

• Magnetic fields of neodymium magnets

In recent years very strong neodymium magnets for toy and office use have become widely available. In this project the static magnetic field of these magnets and their potential influence on pace makers are investigated.

2. **New Policies and Legislations**

Revision of the Swiss "Ordinance relating to protection of the general population from nonionizing radiation in the environment" (ONIR)

The ordinance, in force since 1999, is being revised in order to better specify the implementation of installation limits in the cases where several antennas are placed close to each other.

Report: "Need for Action considering RFID Technology"

In order to answer a question from the parliament a group of experts has reviewed different aspects of RFID technology and analysed a need for action considering health, privacy, environmental and consumer protection. After being accepted by the Federal Council the report will be published on the FOPH website in German, French and Italian (expected in June / July 2008). http://www.bag.admin.ch/rfid-bericht.
