Prior to this, Nathan Belete was the Sector Manager for the World Bank's Sustainable Development Department in Indonesia, responsible for the investment portfolio and policy dialogue in the following core sectors: agriculture, energy, infrastructure, transport, urban services, water resources, environment, and disaster risk reduction, among others. From 2011-2012, he was based in Nairobi, Kenya as the Sector Leader for the Sustainable Development Department to Eritrea, Kenya, Rwanda, and Somalia, as well as the Global Center on Conflict, Security and Development.

Prior to that, Nathan Belete was based in the World Bank's offices in New Delhi (2008-2011) and Beijing (2004-2007) with responsibilities for managing investments in agriculture and rural development, among others. Before joining the World Bank in 2000, he held various positions in Washington, D.C., and throughout Africa with World Vision and UNICEF.
