## Engaging multiple stakeholders towards good governance for health and well being.

The WHO Bangladesh initiated the "Urban Governance for Health and Well-being" to generate collective solutions to enhance health and well-being. Khulna (Bangladesh) for the first phase. The WHO Bangladesh supports Khulna City Corporation (KCC) and the Directorate General of Health Services (DGHS) in

Promoting health, well being, and equity through good urban governance, multisectoral collaboration, and civic engagement. KCC arranged a series of consultative workshops with local leaders, civil society organizations, community leaders, and academia. To address the issue, an MoU was signed between 11 stakeholders on 8th October 2022 to build a sustainable multisectoral coordination platform under the strong leadership of the Mayor, KCC.

### World Antimicrobial Awareness Week 2022

On World Antimicrobial Awareness Week 2022, with the support of WHO, CDC organized a national-level advocacy meeting with quadripartite stakeholders and the representatives of different relevant departments of the Bangladesh Government. The meeting emphasized the importance of raising awareness of antimicrobial resistance and encouraging best practices among policymakers, health workers and the general population. The Minister of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Mr. Zahid Maleque MP, was the chief guest at that meeting.

### Simulation Exercise for emergency response coordination in Bangladesh

A tabletop exercise was held in Bangladesh from 13-15 December 2022 titled "Simulation Exercise for emergency response coordination in Bangladesh." The purpose of the exercise is to strengthen coordination among sectors responsible for disaster management and infectious disease outbreak, including relevant stakeholders and the role of the HEOC/PHEOCs for better preparedness and response.

### 1000 community health workers trained in contact tracing

WHO has been working hard to build the capacities of the health sector in Cox's Bazar to carry out effective contact tracing for a range of health threats. In October, WHO completed the cascading of contact tracing standard operating procedures (SOPs) to Community Health Workers (CHWs) in the FDMN camps. Working on the front lines of the health sector, CHWs are often the first point of contact for anyone with a health condition in the Rohingya camps. They play a critical role in monitoring and managing the spread of disease.



### 1st Infection Prevention and Control conference in Cox's Bazar

WHO Bangladesh held the first Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) conference in Cox's Bazar district on 2 November 2022.

With the theme of implementing IPC programs in crisis settings, the conference gave health-sector partners a chance to share their experiences and learn about core IPC issues. Crucially, they learned how to use WHO's IPC scorecard to manage hygiene standards in healthcare facilities effectively.





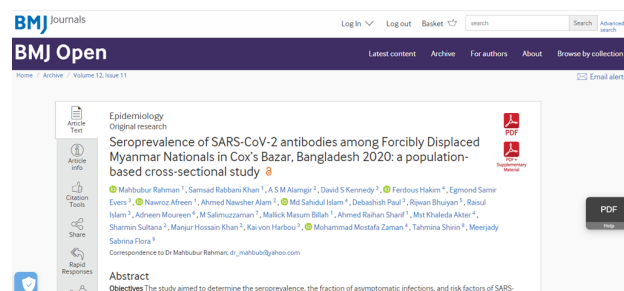
