It was observed that most of the programs, out of the 54 program components, had achieved satisfactory implementation according to the allocated funds from WHO Bangladesh.

DGDA Empowers Physicians with the WHO AWaRe Poster!

To combat the global health concern of antibiotics and focus on rational antibiotic use, the Directorate General of Drug Administration (DGDA) conducted an awareness program, technically and financially supported by WHO BAN, in Chittagong to address antibiotic resistance. DGDA presented the WHO AWaRe (Access, Watch, Reserve) classification, a tool that guides prescribers in choosing appropriate antibiotics for healthcare professionals. The AWaRe classification categorizes antibiotics into three groups based on efficacy and importance in treating infections, promoting rational antibiotic use, and preserving its effectiveness. National Nutrition Week was observed with the theme 'Build a strong nutrition base to build Smart Bangladesh' from 7 to 13 June 2023. On 8 June, focused on adolescents' nutrition, the "NourishNextGen Conference 2023" was organized. Several organizations, including the Institute of Public Health Nutrition (IPHN), World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN), and Nutrition International (NI), jointly organized it. The conference emphasized the significance of healthy eating and maintaining a balanced diet for overall health and well-being. The event included technical sessions, art and quiz competitions, poster presentations, etc.

In collaboration with the MOHFW and WHO Bangladesh, BRAC James P Grant School of Public Health, BRAC University, carried out a study on optimizing community health worker's (CHWs) role in strengthening comprehensive primary health care and health systems resilience: prospects and challenges in Bangladesh. The CHWs were mapped in four Upazilas selected from four Divisions, and various health systems issues and challenges were identified and analyzed in the report. Ms. Sangay Wangmo, Team Leader and other Health System team member of WHO Bangladesh attended and facilitated the dissemination event.

Divisional review meeting on measles-rubella (MR) elimination

The government of Bangladesh is committed to eliminating measles-rubella & CRS and achieving the elimination goal by 2026. As part of that, the government is implementing several activities with the support of WHO. In June, all the divisions conducted divisional-level review meetings to review the divisional progress on the elimination activities and analyze the obstacles to achieving the target and way forward. All the Divisional Directors from the divisions, Civil Surgeons from districts, UHFPOs from the upazilas, and Chief Health Officers from City corporations participated in the meetings. Officers from EPI Head Quarters also joined the meeting to guide the national level. The Surveillance & Immunization Medical Officers and Divisional Coordinators, WHO BAN, provided technical support in this activity.

The workshop aims to strengthen sub-national capacities in emergency preparedness and response. The workshop covered two main themes: natural disasters and disease outbreak management. There 40 participants from different government departments and non-government organizations participated in the workshop.

The Health Cluster meeting in Bangladesh was held on 22nd May 2023 at the WHO Country Office. It was jointly chaired by Dr. Anthony Eshofonie from WHO and Dr. Mahbubur Rahman from IEDCR. The primary aim of the meeting was to strengthen the understanding and enhance the effectiveness of the Health Cluster's work in Bangladesh. Dr. Anthony presented significant milestones related to the cluster approach in Bangladesh. Dr. Anthony introduced a standardized template for TOR review, highlighting its significance in ensuring clarity and consistency. The participants discussed the work methods, regular meetings, agenda sharing, and timely updates in the meeting.

Training on Vaccine Preventable Disease (VPD) Surveillance

To train the Disease Surveillance Focal Persons (DSFP) and new government doctors on VPD Surveillance, the national EPI conducted district-level training in June 2023. After a national-level ToT, all the districts completed the training. More than 5,900 government doctors from all government medical colleges, districts, and upazila hospitals were trained on AFP, measles, and other vaccine-preventable disease surveillance. Surveillance & Immunization Medical Officers and Divisional Coordinators of WHO provided technical support in this activity.

Participation of abroad training & Meeting

Ms Sangay Wangmo, Team Leader, Health System, Dr Murad Sultan, National Professional Officer along with DGDA high official, attended The Seventh Meeting of the Asia-Pacific Network on Access to Medicines under Universal Health Coverage, from 13-14 June 2023, in New Delhi, India. The objectives of the meeting was to update on country situations on access to medical products and discuss relevant policies to improve availability, affordability and price of medical products.

Dr Sabera Sultana, NPO-NTD & Dr Nazis Arefin Saki, NPO-TB from CDS team along with Professor Mamun Al Mahtab, Professor & Head, Interventional Hepatology Division from BSMMU attended "Annual meeting of Strategic and Technical Advisory Group on Viral Hepatitis, HIV and STIs (STAG-HHS)" in South-East Asia Region and joint consultation with National Programme Managers held on 13 to 15 June 2023 in Colombo, Sri Lanka, organized by the WHO Regional Office for South-East Asia. The general objective of the meeting is to support and strengthen the integration across viral hepatitis, HIV and STIs in line with Integrated Regional Action Plan (I-RAP) 2022-2026 and seek technical advice from the STAG members on all aspects of work related to viral hepatitis, HIV and STIs in the Region.

To plan the accelerated implementation of new shorter regimens for the treatment of drug-resistant TB and specialized technical support via the rGLC initiative, a workshop was held on 25 – 27 April 2023 in Bangkok, Thailand. To represent WHO Bangladesh, Dr Anupama Hazarika, Medical Officer, CDS & Nazis Arefin Saki, NPO-TB, participated in the workshop.

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Training on Manuscript Writing for Surgeons of Chattogram

An assessment in Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University showed that there is lack of knowledge and skill of medical teachers on scientific publication. Research and Publication unit of WHO Bangladesh has been supporting academia for building research capacity to fulfill this. Therefore, a training on manuscript writing was conducted on 16–18 May 2023 by Post Graduate Surgery Academia at Chittagong Club, Chattogram. Twenty doctors from various specialties and sub-specialties of surgery participated.

The 3-day participatory training was conducted by WHO Bangladesh. The topics included, literature search in PubMed, reference management using endnote, and data analysis and preparing tables and graphs Microsoft Word and Excel. Participants drafted a manuscript using the skills gathered from the training and presented it. A certificate was provided in the closing session which was graced by Professor Dr. Md. Ismail Khan, the honorable VC of Chattogram Medical University.
