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What is the Codex Alimentarius?

The Codex Alimentarius or "Food Code" is a collection of standards, guidelines and codes of practice adopted by the Codex Alimentarius Commission (CAC)



Why the Codex Alimentarius?

The Codex food standards and related texts aim at:

- ✓ protecting consumers' health and
- ✓ ensuring fair practices in the food trade
- Established in 1963!
- Joint FAO/WHO Food Standards Programme



Codex Standards, Guidelines and Codes of practice

Shall be based on the principle of <u>sound scientific analysis</u> and <u>evidence</u>, involving a thorough review of all relevant information, in order that the standards assure the quality and safety of the food supply.

Standards

Prescriptive, what should be achieved; (e.g. Limit; MRLs etc.)

Guidelines

Principles and guidance how to do something (e.g. Risk Analysis)

Codes of practice


Advice or procedures what to do to avoid an issue or minimize the risk



Codex Standards, Guidelines and Codes of practice

- Are not a substitute for, or alternative to national legislation
- Are voluntary in nature
 - Need to be translated into national legislation or regulations in order to be enforceable
 - Every country's laws and administrative procedures contain provisions with which it is essential to comply
- Reference and benchmark in the WTO SPS agreement

Codex Contact Points

- Act as the link between the Codex Secretariat and Member countries
- Coordinate all relevant Codex activities within their own countries
 - Receive and circulate Codex texts and send comments on Codex documents
- Work in close cooperation with the national Codex committee
- Act as a channel for the exchange of information and coordination of activities with other Codex Members
- Receive the invitation to Codex sessions and inform the relevant chairpersons and the Codex Secretariat of the names of participants from their own countries
- Promote Codex activities throughout their own countries



Codex 2020

- CCEXEC78 physically in Geneva in February 2020
- All technical Codex sessions postponed to 2021 due to the pandemic
 - Progress of work in EWGs including through virtual tools zoom meetings, webinars
- CCEXEC79 successfully held virtually in July 2020
- CAC43 successfully held virtually in November 2020
 - Record in participation
 - Very effective
 - 22 new and revised Codex texts adopted
 - 6 Codex texts adopted at Step 5
 - 6 new work items approved



Codex 2021 – a virtual year!
