THAILAND SITUATION IN THE PAST 24 HOURS


HIGHLIGHTS

- On the 23rd of April 2020, 13 new cases of laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 were announced by the Ministry of Public Health of Thailand, bringing the total number of cases to 2,839.
- Of these, 85.6% (2,430) have recovered, about 1.7% (50) have died, and 12.6% (359) are receiving treatment.
- Only one case was identified in a person returning from outside Thailand; likely reflecting restrictions on entry.
- Five of the new cases are close contacts of previously confirmed cases. Two cases attended crowded places.
- To date, 68 of the total 77 provinces have reported cases. 35 of these 68 provinces have not reported any new cases during the past 14 days. The three provinces that have reported the most cases are Bangkok (1,454), Phuket (197) and Nonthaburi (152). Nine provinces have not reported any cases.

UPDATE FROM THE MINISTRY OF PUBLIC HEALTH OF THAILAND:

Active case finding in Bangkok:

- From March 6th to 17th April at the Acute Respiratory Infection outpatient clinic of the Bangkok Urban Institute for Disease Prevention and Control, a total of 3,350 samples were tested and 94 (2.8%) were found to be positive.
- From April 15-22nd, active case finding was conducted in the Bangkhen community of Bangkok. The samples were taken from the general population including asymptomatic and asymptomatic street food vendors, garbage pickup staff, taxi driver, motorcycle taxi driver, delivery person and bus driver. A total of 1,876 samples were tested and one was found to be positive. Next week active case finding will be performed at the Klongtoei Districts



ADVICE FOR THE PUBLIC

What is the difference between isolation, quarantine, and distancing?





'Quarantine' means restricting activities or separating people who are not ill themselves, but may have been exposed to COVID-19. The goal is to monitor symptoms and detect new cases early.



'Isolation' means separating infected people to prevent the spread of COVID-19.



'Physical distancing' means being physically apart but socially connected, for example with digital tools.
