I. Activity reporting

Goal: to improve existing agency functions regarding social and behavioral determinants of NCDs to ensure their systems are fully functional and performs optimally to promote health and life-year gain, productivity gain, and increase national competitive capacity




Figure 1 Meetings of the Sub-committee (1)




Figure 3 Meetings of the Sub-committee (3)




Figure 4 Meetings of the Sub-committee (4)




Figure 6 The drive of the draft act on controls on the marketing of food and beverages to children (high in fat, sugar, and salt




Figure 7 Strengthened cooperation between other ministries
