

1. Vaccine (EPI) management and guideline development

Strengthening health management system



2. Improvement of health information systems: Standard Digital Migrant Health Data Set

Consultation with key stakeholders of MOPH to collaboratively draft the standard digital migrant health data set, 1st on 22 Feb and 2nd on 9 March 2023.

3. Legal framework development for ensuring the right to health

Law and regulation on healthcare accessibility for migrants. The meeting took place on 30 June 2023, MOPH Chaired by Director of Law Division.

Steps for law and regulation development

- 1. Research and Analysis
- 2. Stakeholder Engagement
- 3. Policy Development
- 4. Legal Framework Establishment
- 5. Healthcare Services Provision
- 6. Financial Considerations
- 7. Monitoring and Evaluation
- 8. Public Awareness and Education
- 9. International Cooperation

Outcome:

- 1) Law and regulation gaps analysis.
- 2) Selected MoPH regulation need to be resolved.



Strategy 2 Network development and Social Movement



Collaborating Network

Collaboration between the Migrant Health Program and the International Organization for Migration (IOM) along the border and neighboring countries is crucial for the advancement of border and migrant health.

- The Workshop on Enhancing Health, Border and Mobility Management in Response to Public Health Emergencies in Thailand on 5 April 2023 at Mandarin Hotel, Bangkok
- The national consultation of migration mapping and health of migrant project implemented in Laos, Cambodia and Thailand will be discuss on 11 August 2023.





Strategy 3 Policy Research



UCEP policy for migrant and non-Thai population (UHC Emergency for all)

Supporting International Health Policy Program (IHPP) for research on

"Feasibility of the inclusion of financial reimbursement for emergency care under "Universal Coverage for Emergency Patients (UCEP)" for Health Insurance for Migrants and Health Insurance for People with Citizenship Problems"

Progress: under process of the final contract approval.

Lessons learned



- 1. Ensuring the health data system is designed to prioritize data privacy and obtain clear consent from migrants before collecting and sharing their health information.
- 2. Develop a system that can easily share data within MoPH Hospitals to ensure continuity of care. But across different healthcare providers and organizations can indeed be challenging.
- 3. User-Centric Design: Involve migrants and IT personnels in the design process to create a system that meets their specific needs and preferences.
- 4. Legal Clarity: Ensure that the migrant laws clearly define the rights, entitlements, and access to health services for migrants.
- 5. Enforcement Mechanisms: Establish effective enforcement mechanisms through the Legal Division to ensure that the laws are followed by both healthcare providers and migrants.

Lessons learned



- 7. Law and regulations Review: Regularly assess the effectiveness of the laws and make necessary adjustments based on feedback and changing migration patterns.
- 8. Network Engagement: Engage a wide range of stakeholders, including government agencies, non-profit organizations, healthcare providers, and migrant communities themselves.
- 9. Mutual Benefits: Clearly articulate the benefits of network engagement for all parties involved, highlighting how collaboration can lead to improved health outcomes for migrants.
- 10. Flexibility: Be adaptable and open to feedback, allowing the network to evolve based on changing needs and circumstances.
- 11. Sustainability: Developing a long-term Migrant Health strategy to sustain the network's activities and ensure its continued impact on improving health services for migrants.


Challenges/barriers to implementation




- 1. Multiple stakeholders:
 - 1) Organization Identifying/mapping defined
- 2) Tailor our engagement approach to each stakeholder's needs and interests, ensuring they feel valued and heard.
- 3) Provide regular updates to stakeholders about the migrant health program's progress, challenges, and achievements to keep them informed and engaged.
- 2. The lengthy process of Migrant Health Data System is a barrier to developing an efficient data system :
 - 1) leveraging existing platforms or tools are possible and
- 2) collaboration with the experienced IT professionals and regular communication with stakeholders can help streamline the development process and ensure that the data system meets the intended goals in a timely manner.
