Lessons learned (1)

Thailand's success in consistently reducing road traffic fatalities can be further enhanced by implementing the Safe System approach and the second decade of the action plan outlined in the 5th Road Safety Plan.

Key measures like promoting helmet use and reducing drink-driving are essential, akin to low-hanging fruit. Achieving success in these areas necessitates 1) impactful public campaigns, 2) stringent law enforcement, and 3) active public support. Systematically addressing obstacles to law enforcement is crucial for lasting results.

Lessons learned (2)

The World Health Organization's social capital can play a vital role in supporting and facilitating comprehensive efforts across various levels, including organizations, the private sector, parliament, and government.

The support mechanisms from parliament have the power to address road traffic accident problems both legislatively and operationally, necessitating consistent and robust evidence support.

Challenges/barriers to implementation

Thailand lacks a clear Lead agency responsible for road safety.

Political policies, such as increasing the speed limit to 120 km/h, allowing free production of alcohol, and extending alcohol sales hours, contribute negatively, increasing the risk of road accidents.

Thailand also lacks clear policies outlining the direction of multimodal transportation and land use, which are critical for achieving sustainable development goals.
