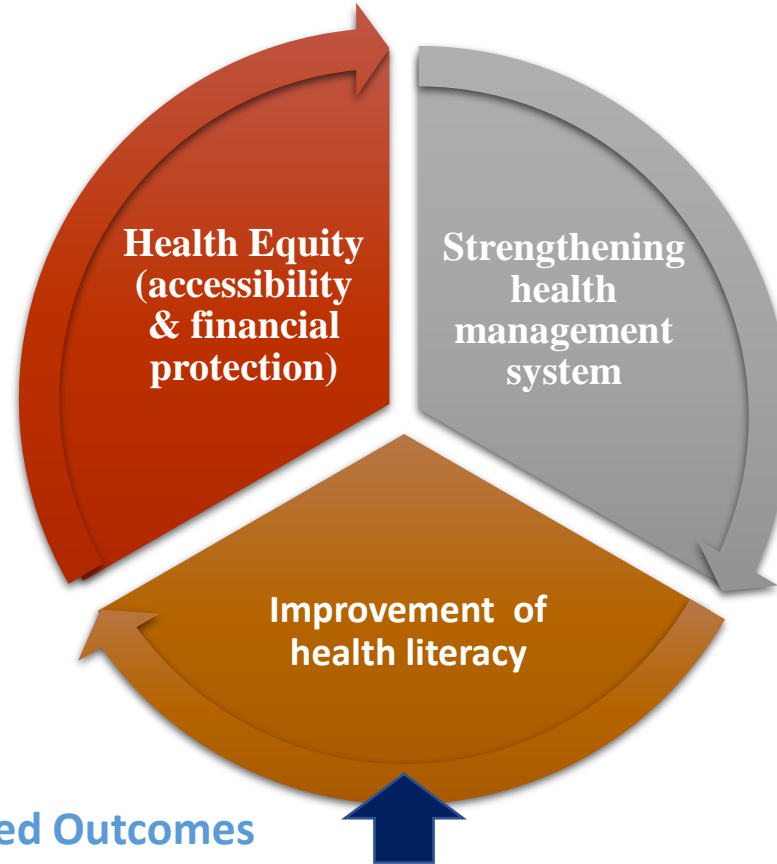
Goal

Enhancing UHC among non-Thai populations.

- Working together with NHCO and other key stakeholders through the process of National Health Assembly (NHA), and the Issue-based Health Assembly (IHA).
- On 21 June 2022, the cabinet acknowledge the 14th NHC resolutions on the protection of equitable access to health services by specific populations in crises
- On 27 Dec. 2022, the cabinet acknowledge the IHA resolutions on the right to health of migrant workers
