Background

The WASH sector has two main tools for monitoring WASH investments and WASH systems hosted by the WHO Water, Sanitation, Hygiene and Health (WSH) unit:

- The Global Analysis and Assessment of Sanitation and Drinking-Water (GLAAS), which provides
 policy- and decision-makers with a comprehensive global analysis of investments and the
 enabling environment for WASH; and
- The development of WASH accounts to track financing to WASH at the national and subnational levels based on the TrackFin methodology.

WHO has continued to expand activities related to GLAAS and WASH accounts in response to increasing demand from countries and global partners.

In the last GLAAS cycle 124 countries participated and more are expected for the next GLAAS cycle to be launched in April 2024. This requires intensive technical inputs for an updated GLAAS survey, country trainings/orientations, country implementation and quality reviews and data analysis and reporting.

There are currently over 20 countries developing WASH accounts, with more countries requesting support to launch WASH accounts or to implement new cycles of WASH accounts. WHO (GLAAS) also needs technical inputs to developing new WASH accounts materials and updating existing materials in English and Spanish. In addition, countries need expert technical inputs to support their development of WASH accounts including training and capacity building in English and Spanish.

- 1.1: Develop or review and/or format requested WASH accounts materials including technical notes and training presentations in English and Spanish

- 1.3: Provide inputs and edits to the WASH accounts production tool (WAPT) content in English and Spanish
- 1.4: Test the WAPT and WAPT questionnaires as requested and provide inputs to the update of the WAPT user guide
- 1.5: Regularly update the WASH accounts country summary sheets for assigned countries and request information from GLAAS team members to update all other countries and update the WASH accounts overview timeline.
