Around 12.6 million deaths a year are due to preventable environmental health risks

which represents 23% of the global burden of disease.

This is of critical concern for the public health community. Factors such as **air pollution**, **unsustainable urbanisation**, and the continuing risk of **infectious diseases** related to water, sanitation and the changing climate are heavily contributing to the burden of NCDs.
