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Overview of Existing Intellectual Property System

- Patent
 - Traditional medicinal knowledge based inventions
 - Pharmaceutical products
 - Mixed herbs
 - An effective component extracted and purified from traditional medicine
 - Processing methods for products
 - New indications of known medicine
- Copyright
 - Books and other works on traditional medicinal knowledge
 - Compilations and databases
- Trademarks and Geographical Indications
 - Products based on traditional medicinal knowledge
- Trade Secret
 - Undisclosed traditional medicinal knowledge



However, there are gaps, so...

- Sui generis regimes
 - the Specialist Health Training and Plant Medicine Research Act, 2011 (Act 833) in Ghana
 - ■With respect to intellectual property rights, the Act provides that rights pertaining to an invention supported by the Centre are to determined by agreement between the Centre and the inventor or the inventor or the employer of the inventor.
- Customary laws and practices
- Non-IP tools
 - Documentation: databases/registers
