

WHO GLOBAL UPDATE

- United States (Pfizer Incorporated and Moderna Incorporated) has announced that their vaccine candidates were now over 90% effective against the covid-19, details here.
- The European Commission, France, Spain, The Republic of Korea and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation pledge US\$360 million to COVAX, the Vaccines Pillar of the ACT Accelerator, details here.
- WHO established Council on the Economics of Health for All. The Council, comprising top economists and health experts, will focus on investments in health, and achieving sustainable, inclusive and innovation-led economic growth, details here.

WHO COUNTRY UPDATE

WHO Country Office for India (WCO) continues to work closely with MoHFW, on preparedness and response measures including epidemiological assessment, surveillance, testing, case management, containment and research activities for COVID-19 at the national, state and district level.


- Coordination: WCO continues to provide technical support to MoHFW through JMG (Joint Monitoring Group)
 at the national level and through task force/control rooms at the state and district level in Andhra Pradesh,
 Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, and Puducherry
- Surveillance, Contact Tracing, Containment: Country office continues to provide technical support for COVID-19 containment activities in Karnataka, Puducherry, and Telangana
 - In Uttar Pradesh, to identify ILI/SARI symptoms, a total of 2,88,15,423 houses have been covered and 106,033 symptomatic identified with the support of WHO field teams
- Risk Communication and Community Engagement: WHO launched a series of information videos for COVID Appropriate behaviours particularly during the festive season. The aim is to promote key preventive behaviors for COVID-19 with a special focus on 3Ws: Wash your hands, Wear your mask, Watch your distance. We hope this will keep the festivals joyful for everyone, details available here.
- Infection Prevention and Control and Hospital Preparedness: In Karnataka WCO officers are members of District Expert committee and continue to support in assessing hospital preparedness and adherence to SOPs
 - Reorientation training completed for PHC/ UPHC staff in all 33 districts in Telangana and continues to support assessment of PHCs and COVID hospitals
- Research and Development: Supporting field work related to primary immunodeficiency disorder (PID) study
 in Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu
 - WCO is supporting 20 high-burden facilities on standardizing COVID and pregnancy care
- Information and Planning: WCO is supporting Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala, and Puducherry in preparation of database for health care workers for COVID-19 vaccine
 - WCO continues to provide technical inputs for case fatality ratio analysis and death audit in Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Chhattisgarh, Puducherry, Telangana, and Tamil Nadu
 - Supporting serosurvey activities in Bihar and Karnataka
- Laboratory testing: India tested 12,56,98,525 cumulative samples by 12 October and 8,61,706 samples were tested on 15 November, reported by <u>ICMR</u>.
