

As of 30 November, India reported 9,431,691 confirmed cases. Past few days saw a slight increase in daily cases, which are now again declining. 38,772 confirmed cases were reported while 291, 826 cases were reported in the past week alone with is 6,732 cases per million. WHO COUNTRY UPDATE

WHO Country Office for India (WCO) continues to work closely with MoHFW, on preparedness and response measures including epidemiological assessment, surveillance, testing, case management, containment and research activities for COVID-19 at the national, state and district level.


- Coordination: WCO continues to provide technical support to MoHFW through JMG (Joint Monitoring Group) at the national level and through task force/control rooms at the state and district level.
- Vaccine Preparation: On behalf of UNCT, WHO presented the vaccine preparation and support plan to the task force on vaccine conducted by NITI Ayog. WHO is also supporting the preparation of vaccine roll-out as well as developing software for capturing adverse events following vaccination.
 - WCO is providing strategic technical support in Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Madhya Pradesh for preparing for COVID-19 vaccination
- Contact Tracing, Containment: WCO providing supportive supervision to monitor contact tracing; identify containment zones and sharing regular feedback with government health officials on regular basis.
- ILI Surveillance: In Uttar Pradesh, to identify ILI/SARI symptoms, a total of 2,96,77,426 houses have been covered and 118,020 symptomatic identified with the support of WHO field teams
- Risk Communication and Community Engagement: WCO is working with IIPH, Gandhinagar and IIM,
 Ahmedabad in Gujarat on the state's Intra-Action Review (IAR). WHO is also working on creating films/videos on vaccine awareness and other related topics.
- Infection Prevention and Control and Hospital Preparedness: WCO supported the Antimicrobial resistance (AMR or AR) awareness week. WHO partnered with CSIR to launch a game on AMR.
- Research and Development: WCO is supporting 11 Unity Studies and 20 high-burden facilities on standardizing COVID and pregnancy care SCOPE Study.
- Information and Planning: WHO is supporting Kerala, Telangana and Tamil Nadu in preparation of database for health care workers for COVID-19 vaccination
- Laboratory testing: India tested 14,13,49,298 cumulative samples and 9,69,322 samples were tested on 30 November, reported by ICMR.
 - Total Operational Laboratories reporting to ICMR include Government labs: 1176 and Private labs: 994
 - WCO continues to review testing strategy, number of samples tested and test positivity rate in states and share feedback on strengthening testing strategy.
