HIGHLIGHTS

- Union Health Minister emphasizes that vaccination should not lead to complacency in following COVID appropriate behaviors, and all preventive measures should continue to be followed (Link)



INDIA SITUATION

As of 8 February 2021, India reported a total of 10,838,194 confirmed cases. Daily cases in India continue to decline with 148,609 active cases, 155,080 total deaths, 10,534,505 discharged as on 08.02.2021 and total vaccinations done nationwide are 58,12,362 to date, details here.

WHO GLOBAL UPDATE

- WHO launched free OpenWHO.org training on rehabilitation for COVID-19, details here.
- WHO announced updated critical concentrations for susceptibility testing to rifampicin, whereby critical concentrations for culture-based phenotypic drug susceptibility testing (DST) to first-line anti-TB drugs have been revised and lowered while those for isoniazid have been maintained at the present level, details here.

WHO COUNTRY UPDATE

WHO Country Office for India (WCO) continues to work closely with MoHFW, in responding to COVID-19 and roll out of Covid19 vaccination at the national, state and district level.


- Coordination: WCO continues to provide technical support to MoHFW through JMG (Joint Monitoring Group) at the national level and through task force/control rooms at the state and district level.
 - WCO personnel continue to be deployed with MoHFW to support SHOC room at NCDC
 - In Kerala, WCO personnel continue to attend periodic review meetings chaired by Health Minister regarding COVID-19 response and vaccination
 - In Tamil Nadu, WCO personnel also participated in the 14th Expert Committee meeting chaired by Chief Minister on COVID-19 response and vaccination campaign
- COVID-19 vaccination: WCO is tracking trainings and formation review meetings of States and district task forces and providing daily update to MOHFW on progress of vaccination.
 - High level oversight is being provided for vaccination sessions by WHO teams at district and state levels
 - 48 Rapid Response Teams have been deployed in North Eastern and other states/UTs to support COVID
 19 vaccination roll out
 - WCO is supporting counselling sessions targeting vaccine hesitancy amongst healthcare workers
- Risk communication and Community Engagement: WCO continues to host radio programs across 10 States on COVID appropriate behaviors; with a reach of 24 million/week across public and private radio channels
 - As part of mass IEC campaign, WCO is guiding Maharashtra and Goa in identification of prominent places in the state wherein motor vans with LED display can be stationed to promote COVID appropriate behaviors and COVID-19 vaccination
- Essential Services: WCO together with UN Women has started the VAW Prevention Program: RESPECT Implementation Package: Pilot Roll-out in Asia Pacific. This series of 10 workshops online includes participants from MoHFW, MWCD and various stakeholders across 7 States in India.
 - Efforts to strengthen VPD surveillance and immunization are underway across the country
 - MR and AFP surveillance workshops and review meetings to strengthen immunization are also being supported across India
- Laboratory testing: To date, India has tested more than 201,900,614 samples. Tests include both, RTPCR and Rapid Antigen. India's current test positivity rate (7DMA) is 1.69%. A total of 532,236 tests were done on 7 February 2021, details at ICMR.
 - WCO personnel in Chhattisgarh are supporting establishment of DPT laboratory set-up in coordination with AlIMS, Raipur
