

## **INDIA SITUATION**


• Top five states, namely, Maharashtra, Kerala, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Andhra Pradesh are contributing 56% of total cases. In the last seven days 2,14,955 cases reported in country with Kerala reporting highest number of cases (1,33,669, 70% of total cases) followed by Maharashtra (23,881) and Tamil Nadu (11,622).






## **COVID-19: STATUS ACROSS STATES**

In the past week (15-21 September), as compared to previous week (8-14 September), a gradual declining trend was observed (-7%) in the total number of cases reported across India. Higher decline has been reported from D&N Haveli (-100%), Jharkhand (-56%), Madhya Pradesh (-41%) and Chandigarh (-26%). The trend on daily cases and deaths are given below:

- In Madhya Pradesh, special vaccination campaign for pregnant mothers is ongoing (21-24 September)
- In **Punjab**, teaching and non-teaching school staff who are vaccinated with at least with one dose, have been asked to resume duties, subject to submission of weekly RTPCR negative test reports
- In Uttar Pradesh, special vaccination camps are being held for people with disabilities every Monday.

### WHO GLOBAL UPDATE

- WHO has expanded the global community of practice of infodemic managers to more than 500 trainees from 120 countries following the completion of the 2nd WHO Global Infodemic Management training, details here
- The heads of the International Monetary Fund, World Bank Group, WHO and WTO met with the CEOs of leading
  vaccine manufacturing companies to discuss strategies to improve the access to COVID-19 vaccines, especially
  in low- and lower middle-income countries and in Africa, details here
- WHO is urging leaders attending the 76<sup>th</sup> session of the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) to guarantee equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines and other life-saving tools; ensure the world is better prepared to respond to future pandemics; and renew efforts to achieve the SDGs, details here
- WHO has released a new competency framework, <u>Building a response workforce to manage infodemics</u>. WHO, in partnership with the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), conducted qualitative research and consultation to produce this document, details <u>here</u>.

## WHO COUNTRY UPDATE

#### Coordination

- WCO continues to provide technical support to MoHFW, NCDC, ICMR and NDMA at the national level and through task force/control rooms at the state and district level in **Andhra Pradesh**, **Karnataka**, **Kerala**, **Ta mil Nadu**, **Telangana**, and **Puducherry**.
- WCO officials of various States continue to participate in meetings on current response, third wave preparations, vaccination; chaired by Chief Ministers, Health Ministers, Chief and/or Health Secretaries, MDs – NHM, etc

### COVID-19 vaccination

- Technical oversight during vaccination is provided by WHO teams at district and state levels.
- WCO is supporting monitoring of vaccination sessions across the country and continues to provide surge support for training, microplanning and monitoring.

#### Surveillance, Contact Tracing and Containment

Country office continues to provide technical support for COVID-19 containment activities in UttarPradesh;
 also provided supportive supervision to monitor contact tracing; identify containment zones and sharing regular feedback with government health officials on regular basis

#### **Training and Operations Research**

- Supporting training on IHIP portal in Odisha
- Supporting training of medical officers on Routine Immunization in Tamil Nadu
- Continuing to support re-orientation of District Surveillance Officers (DSOs) in Uttar Pradesh
- Supported mask compliance survey phase -III survey in West Bengal
- Supporting implementation of sero-survey in **Himachal Pradesh**

#### **Essential Services**

- Supporting Karnataka and Tamil Nadu in strengthening and streamlining AEFI surveillance.
- Supporting **Delhi, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, and West Bengal** with fever and rash surveillance.

As of 21 September, India has tested more than 540 million samples. Tests include both, RTPCR and Rapid Antigen. India's current test positivity rate (7DMA) is 2.1%.
