Mental health and wellbeing of the health and care workforce: Launch of the MeND (Mental Health of Nurses and Doctors survey in the European Union, Iceland and Norway) Report

Overview

Over the past few years, health systems globally have faced numerous challenges, with workforce retention and recruitment being a critical concern. In Europe shortages are projected to experience a three-fold increase by 2030 compared to 2013. The growing shortage is exacerbating a mental health and wellbeing crisis among our health workers with approximately one-third of HCWs reporting symptoms consistent with depression and/or anxiety disorders. The consequences are farreaching, including increased absenteeism, burnout, and the intention to leave the profession altogether. This highlights an urgent need for targeted policy-making to address workforce retention and well-being. High-quality data is essential to fully understand the scope of this issue and inform effective interventions.

In October 2024, WHO EURO launched a survey aimed at HCWs in the EU27, Iceland and Norway. The survey is one of many actions under a collaboration between WHO and the European Commission through which WHO is providing tailored support to these countries to build stronger mental health systems and services. The aim is to improve our understanding of the mental health and wellbeing of HCWs in these countries. The survey was designed to incorporate validated tools that screen for mental health issues and well-being, while understanding their intersectionality with sociodemographics and work-related characteristics.

The proposed side event will present the findings and engage with partners, Member States and professional representatives to discuss public health policies that improve working conditions for HCWs.
